

FROM THE PRESIDENT'S DESK.....

The State of the Chapter Address:

The Chapter has reestablished its strive towards excellence. Recruitment, athletics, campus involvement, and academics are four areas of Greek life in which we have reasserted ourselves as leaders on campus.

Now that this chapter has risen to the top of the Greek system, it must continue to take steps that will ensure it maintains that status. The decision to make the chapter house and property an Alcohol-Free facility was one of those steps. On July 1, 1998, Theta Tau will implement an early adoption of the International Headquarters Alcohol-Free Housing Initiative.

There are many benefits to this decision. One, the scholastic atmosphere in the house will be greatly improved. Two, recruitment efforts will be even more rewarding, because men should not pledge a fratemity merely for partying purposes. They should pledge, because they want to be associated with the brothers in the fratemity. Three, the undergraduate chapter's liability and legal risk are now greatly reduced.

But perhaps the most impacting benefit of this decision is the leadership that this decision shows not only to the other fraternities on this campus, but also to the International Fraternity.

What type of support and assistance does the chapter need at this time? We need organizational, planning and support toward the long term goals of the fratemity. The foremost of these are the payment of the current house mortgage and acquiring the property adjacent to the house.

How do Graduate Brothers fit into today's overall picture of the fratemity? First of all, we recognize the fact that that if it had not been for those who lead the charge year after year before us, we would not have a chapter to enjoy today. If it had not been for you men who handed down the traditions of Phi Gamma Delta year after year, Theta Tau would not be here today.

However, graduation does not mean that active interest in the undergraduate chapter has to end. The effort has begun to organize a Graduate Association for this chapter. It will serve to get graduates involved with each other on a social level and it would provide an avenue to allow graduate brothers to become involved in the business aims of the fratemity. This chapter has usen to a prominent level of success, but it will need its graduate's assistance and support to maintain that success through the coming years. The chapter is as strong as it has ever been, and it is only getting stronger.
