

Fall 2007

Chapter GPA: 2.829 Pledge GPA: 2.826

There were 34 brothers and pledges that made a 3.0 or higher out of 85 men, with 7 people making a 4.0. (Six Clicks!).

Spring 2008

Chapter GPA: **3.012** Pledge GPA: **3.270**

For the Spring semester there were 49 brothers and pledges that made a 3.0 or higher out of 81 men, that's 60%! There were also 5 people making a 4.0!

Six Clicks! To the chapter for reaching this long running goal! The Spring GPA is the highest our chapter has received in at least 9 years possibly longer!

Compared to the other fraternities, in the Fall we finished second to Sigma Phi Epsilon who obtained a 2.975. In the Spring we finished first overall. Our chapter did better than both the all Greek average and the all male average in both semesters. Theta Tau will continue to push to stay above our goal of 3.0 as we move into this new year. We will continue to raise the bar, and strive to attain our goals!

Strategic priorities.

To remain healthy and vibrant, every organization must identify its priorities and develop a plan to address them. That is one of the most important responsibilities of the Archons as the Board of Directors of the Fraternity.


Mindful of that responsibility and eager to assure that their two years guiding Phi Gamma Delta would have a positive and lasting impact, the Archons met on September 28-30, 2006, on the campus of Washington and Jefferson College, just eight miles from Canonsburg and the former site of old Jefferson College. Their purpose was two-fold: to set their priorities for the next two years, and, even more important, to set a direction for Phi Gamma Delta that will guide the Fraternity into our 170th year in 2018.

Two Priorities

The board recognized that one key in strategic planning is focus, that having too many initiatives, though all may seem important, can impede success. They therefore resisted the temptation to build a long list of initiatives. Instead they identified two vital areas of focus that will have broadest impact on the of the Fraternity: 1. **Graduate Involvement**, with the aim of developing brothers who are **LOYAL FOR LIFE**

GRADUATE INVOLVEMENT: What can you do?

- Reach out to your pledge brothers or chapter contemporaries. (Get their information from the Headquarters.)
- Attend or plan a reunion of graduate brothers.
- Participate in a graduate chapter or help start one in your city.
- Attend a Pig Dinner, and encourage other brothers to attend.
- Stop by the chapter house when you are on campus.
- Send an update to your chapter to include in the next graduate newsletter.
- · Inform the Headquarters when you move or your contact information changes.
- Share your talents with a chapter as a Purple Legionnaire, BCA or House Corporation member.
- Respond when the Fraternity requests graduate dues (\$20 per year).
- Donate to the Educational Foundation to support its educational grants and scholarships.
- Say "I AM a Phi Gam."
- 2. **Growth** in number and size of undergraduate chapters, to **EXPAND THE INFLUENCE** of Phi Gamma Delta. (Goal 170 chapters by 2018)

A YEAR OF HONORS

The past year has been a wonderful year for the brothers of the Theta Tau chapter of Phi Gamma Delta. They have demonstrated once again why they are the best. The brothers have received honors in every aspect of greek life. This includes everything from philanthropies to academics. Some of the awards and honors we have received are:

Pledge Education Update

Over the past few semesters, Theta Tau has strived to put extra emphasis on the importance of our Pledge Education Program, and we believe it has paid off. After a couple of semesters of poor pledge retention, mostly due to low grades and loss of interest, we decided to step back and truly investigate the good and bad points of our program. We had a solid foundation from past traditions and our pledge education manual, but still had areas that needed improvement. The biggest areas that we modified and focused on were pledge class unity and scholarship.

We stressed pledge class unity and a "succeed together, fail together" mentality from day one, and let them realize they are only as strong as their weakest link. We wanted to get back to brothers being proud of their pledge class and believing that together they could have a positive impact on the chapter. They learned how to

work together throughout the semester, but especially on their pledge class retreat working on a local brother's family farm. Mending fences, cleaning barns, and landscaping taught them they had to depend on one another to get the job done right. They used the money they raised during the retreat and throughout the semester to improve the house by building a covered bike rack in the fall, and enclosing the trophy case with Plexi-glass in the spring. Both projects turned out well and gave them something to look at and be proud of.

They were also taught the importance of scholarship and what it takes to be a successful college student. We implemented mandatory library study hours and grade sheets that their professors filled out a few times over the semester. We taught them that it is about more than just making the grade, but instead really striving to do your best and taking full advantage of each opportunity you are given. We hope this has taught them more productive study habits they can continue to use in their college career and help to improve scholarship throughout the chapter. We believe these changes are already paying off and can be seen by last semester's pledge GPA of 3.270 which brought the fraternity's GPA above the 3.0 threshold.

Overall we believe these and other changes to the pledge education program are greatly increasing our pledge retention rates. The last three semesters have had greater than 75 percent pledge retention, and peaked last semester with over 90 percent retention. We realize retention isn't everything, and still continue to release pledges that aren't Phi Gam material from the program. Our goal however, is to give every worthy pledge the skills they need to succeed in the fraternity, and ensure that they have the opportunity to join us inside the walls of Phi Gamma Delta.

THETA TAU RECEIVES FRATERNITY AWARDS FOR 2007

The **Cheney Cup** is awarded to the undergraduate chapter which demonstrates the greatest all-around efficiency in scholarship, fraternity relationships, and general collegiate activities.

Third Place: Theta Tau at Tennessee Tech University

The **Coon Plaque** is awarded to the undergraduate chapter that has produced the best chapter publication for the preceding academic year. In other words... The Golden Eagle Fiji! Second Place: Theta Tau at Tennessee Technological University

> The Brightman Trophy is presented to the undergraduate chapter which best demonstrates that "Phi Gamma Delta is not for college days alone" by maintaining and improving relations between the chapter and graduate brothers. Third Place: Theta Tau at Tennessee Technological University

The Zerman Trophy (known as the Archons Trophy prior to 1986) is awarded to the undergraduate chapter which excels in promoting the involvement of brothers in student government, the campus newspaper, and extracurricular activities.

First Place: Theta Tau at Tennessee Tech University

The **Jordan Bowl** is awarded to the undergraduate chapter which is judged to have achieved the highest comparative scholarship among the undergraduate chapters for the preceding academic year. Third Place: Theta Tau at Tennessee Technological University

The **Baker Cup** is awarded to the undergraduate chapter which most effectively focuses attention upon religious, ethical, and social service activities in its daily conduct.

Honorable Mention: Theta Tau at Tennessee Technological University

The **Crowder Cup** is awarded to the faculty advisor determined to be the most outstanding in the Fraternity based on personality, leadership, rapport with the chapter and assistance to the chapter in its relationship with faculty members and the host institution, as well as encouraging the undergraduate members to realize their full academic potential.

First Place: Dr. Jed Young (Purdue 1984) - Tennessee Tech University

The **Coulter Cup** is awarded to the graduate brother who has contributed the most to an undergraduate chapter through service in a capacity other than as a Purple Legionnaire or General Officer.

Third Place: Robert L. "Lee" Wray (Tennessee Tech 1981)

The **Durrance** Award is presented to the graduate brother who is judged to be the most outstanding Purple Legionnaire (chapter advisor) in the Fraternity, "judged on the basis of personality, leadership, rapport with chapter, and fraternity service.'

First Place: Bo W. Byers (Tennessee Tech 2006)





Theta Tau Wins Zerman Trophy!

Our Brothers were pleasantly surprised at the 2008 Ekklesia when our chapter's name was called as the first place winner of the Zerman Trophy. This recognizes the hard work the chapter brothers have put into activities on campus including Homecoming, Intramurals, Philanthropic Events, and participation of brothers in campus organizations.
